## Submission requirements

The journal offers:

- A global arena for disseminating outcome measure implementation, experiences and best practices
- An international forum for the conveyance of knowledge on how to measure and report upon key and robust outcomes that matter for professionals and their clients
- A portal for the sharing of collaborative tools used by professionals and organisations experienced in measuring successes and adapting to new methods of practice
- A published evidence base on the impact of implementing comprehensive client/professional group-focused, practice-based, outcome measurement.

As such, we will look for submissions that do any of the following:

- Offers a critical discussion of any area of contemporary professional practice
- Describes applications of research findings, innovation or other initiative to an area of professional practice; and particularly which might be considered and applied by analogy to other disciplines
- Brings together transdisciplinary activities in relation to professional practice
- Explores the inter-relationship of professional practice
- Contributes to recent developing conversations within professional practice
- Offers innovative, surprising, unexpected and creative innovations within a professional practice context
- Has an emphasis on a professional work-related application
- Student project work, posters, research or other outputs are also welcome to be submitted for consideration of publication
