

Applying for University Accommodation

All KMMS students are guaranteed accommodation on one of the university campuses as long as they complete their applications before July 31st. You need to have accepted your offer either as insurance or firm before applying for accommodation.

Specific room allocations will be communicated to our students after the A-level results day (Thursday 15 August).

Research Spotlight

Year 4 Students Research Success



In Year 4 students have been given the opportunity to complete an individual research project (IRP). Two of our students, Oseyi Omokhoa and Mary McDonald, presented their research into aspects of breast cancer care at the East



Kent Hospitals University Foundation Trust (EKHUFT) Clinical Audit Symposium held in the Pears building in March. We are delighted to share that Oseyi - pictured with Dr Des Holden, Chief Medical Officer EKHUFT - also won the Medical Student Project Award for her work, a clinical audit she completed focussing on identifying racial inequalities in the treatment pathway of Black Asian and Minority Ethnic patients with breast cancer who were treated at Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells Hospital Breast Care Unit.

Alzheimer's diagnosis Research Project




Dr Joanne Rodda, Senior Lecturer at KMMS, and Consultant Psychiatrist at the Kent and Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership Trust (KMPT) and Professor Lisa Dikomititis, Director of Research at KMMS and Director of the Centre for Health Services Studies and Honorary Consultant in Patient and Public Engagement at KMPT, worked with Professor Jonathan Schott and Dr Ashvini Keshavan at the National Hospital for Neurology and University College London (UCL) as co-applicants for a successful £4 million grant to fund a study of the application of a blood biomarker for Alzheimer's disease in routine clinical practice.

£1.14 million funding success for undergraduate research opportunities

We are delighted to announce that we have been successful in securing funding from [National Institute for Health and Care Research \(NIHR\)](#), to support medical students expand their experience in research. The funds will support 28 KMMS students to undertake summer internships in research, and 21 students to study intercalated Master's

degrees over the next three years.
